First therapeutic report of temozolomide to treat human gliomas¹⁾.

Intraosseous nerves within the vertebral body were described in 1998 by Antonacci et al²⁾.

In 1998, a group led by Dr. Jerry Oakes³⁾ identified five patients with syringomyelia and no evidence of tonsillar herniation (i.e. no Chiari I malformation).

Medtronic aquired Sofamor Danek in 1998.

Vicari in 1994⁴⁾ and Drs. Barone and Jimenez in 1998⁵⁾ introduced endoscopic-assisted craniostomy followed by application of a molding helmet.
