

Benzodiazepine for alcohol withdrawal syndrome

Benzodiazepines (BDZs) is the mainstay for [alcohol withdrawal syndrome](#) treatment. They reduce [autonomic hyperactivity](#) and may prevent [seizures](#) and/or [delirium tremens](#). All BDZs are effective. Initial doses are higher than those used for treating [anxiety](#). Symptom triggered dosing with repeated evaluation utilizing a standardized protocol (e.g. CIWA-Ar ¹⁾) may be more efficacious than fixed-dose schedules ²⁾

Avoid IM administration (erratic absorption).
