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BMC Medical Education (ISSN 1472-6920) is an open-access, peer-reviewed journal that focuses on the education and training of healthcare professionals at all levels.

- **Open access & broad scope**: Covers undergraduate, postgraduate, and continuing education in medicine and healthcare.
- **Transparent peer review**: Option to publish reviewer reports; editorial decisions based on scientific soundness, not novelty.
- Efficient publication: Median time to first decision ~19 days; acceptance ~160 days.
- Reputation: Q1-ranked journal; Impact Factor ~3.5; SJR ~0.95; indexed in PubMed and Scopus.

△ Limitations

- **Emphasis on methodology over impact**: Accepts papers based solely on technical validity, which may reduce practical relevance.
- **Limited generalizability**: Many studies are single-center or survey-based, sometimes with self-report bias.
- Narrative over systematic reviews: Prioritizes narrative reviews (often commissioned) over unsolicited systematic ones.
- **Fragmented outputs**: Tendency to publish narrowly scoped studies (least publishable unit phenomenon).

□ Academic Perceptions

- **Balance problem**: The journal explores educational innovations, but risks overvaluing novelty without long-term educational benefit.
- "Must-read" criteria unclear: Even among its own readership, the definition of high-impact or practice-changing articles is debated.
- **Strong in methodology, variable in depth**: High internal validity, but mixed external validity across contexts.
