

Case overview method

The establishment of a [case overview](#) method of MMR is feasible for a community hospital NICU. It increases staff and physician group awareness and education over common and complex mortality and morbidity etiologies, improves staff participation with unit management, links case presentations with open discussion and action items, and identifies opportunities for systemic changes to improve patient care ¹⁾.

Identification of the Case: This requires [analysis](#) and understanding.

Background Information: Provide [background](#) information about the case. This may include relevant historical context, key individuals or entities involved, and any other pertinent details.

Case Objectives or Goals: Clearly outline the objectives or [goals](#) of examining the case. What are you trying to achieve by reviewing this case? This could involve diagnosing a medical condition, solving a problem, etc.

Issues and Challenges: Identify and articulate the main issues or challenges presented by the case. This could include obstacles that need to be addressed.

Facts and Evidence: Present the key facts and [evidence](#) associated with the case. This may involve data, witness statements, documents, or any other information relevant to understanding the case.

Analysis and Evaluation: Conduct a thorough analysis of the case. This could involve applying relevant theories, frameworks, or methodologies depending on the nature of the case. Evaluate the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats associated with the case.

Alternatives and Solutions: Consider and propose alternative courses of action or solutions to address the issues identified in the case. Discuss the potential outcomes and implications of each alternative.

Recommendations: Based on the analysis and evaluation, provide recommendations for how the case should be handled or resolved. Justify these recommendations with sound reasoning and evidence.

Lessons Learned: Conclude the case overview by summarizing the key lessons learned from the case. This could involve insights that can be applied to similar situations in the future.
