

Chiasmal syndrome

Chiasmal syndrome is the set of signs and symptoms that are associated with lesions of the [optic chiasm](#), manifesting as various impairments of the sufferer's [visual field](#) according to the location of the lesion along the optic nerve. [pituitary neuroendocrine tumors](#) are the most common cause; however, chiasmal syndrome may be caused by cancer, or associated with other medical conditions such as [multiple sclerosis](#) and [neurofibromatosis](#).

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
