Definition Clinical effectiveness is the extent to which specific clinical interventions, when used under usual or routine conditions of care, achieve the desired outcome in real-world patients". — Key Aspects * ☐ Real-world focus: Evaluates treatments in everyday clinical settings, not just in research trials. * ☐ Outcome-oriented: Focuses on meaningful health outcomes (e.g., survival, symptom relief, quality of life). * ☐ Comparative: Often involves comparing different interventions or care strategies. — Distinction with Efficacy * ☐ Efficacy → How well a treatment works in ideal, controlled conditions (e.g., RCTs). * ☐ Effectiveness → How well it works in routine clinical practice. — Applications * Development of clinical guidelines * Support for evidence-based medicine * Foundation for health policy and value-based care — See also**: real-world evidence, comparative effectiveness, efficacy vs effectiveness
