Colorectal [adenocarcinoma](#) is a type of [cancer](#) that starts in the large intestine. Colorectal stands for your colon and rectum, which make up the large intestine. There are different types of colon and [rectal cancer](#), but [adenocarcinoma](#) is the most common.

Mou et al. speculated that [ATOH1](#) may influence the efficacy of [Immune checkpoint inhibitors](#) therapy in patients with [colorectal adenocarcinoma](#) by affecting the immune microenvironment and [immunogenicity](#) of the tumor ¹⁾.
