

Comparative

1. The study involves comparing two or more groups, conditions, or variables.
2. For example, it might compare health outcomes in patients exposed to a particular risk factor versus those who are not, or compare the effectiveness of different treatments.
3. The comparison helps identify differences or associations between groups.
