

Destructive

Definition: *Destructive* refers to any action, behavior, or communication that **harms, undermines, or impedes progress**, often by causing damage, division, or discouragement—**without offering solutions or alternatives**.

Characteristics

- Dismissive, aggressive, or demoralizing tone.
- Focuses on **blame, failure, or personal attack**.
- Lacks constructive purpose or intent to improve.
- Often fueled by ego, resentment, or rivalry.

Usage Contexts

- **Destructive criticism:** Feedback that invalidates or belittles without suggesting improvement.
- **Destructive behavior:** Actions that disrupt collaboration, morale, or integrity.
- **Destructive rivalry:** Competition that leads to sabotage, dishonesty, or breakdown of professional relations.

Opposite Term

- Constructive – aimed at building, improving, and generating positive outcomes.

Application Example

- A destructive editorial culture allows publication of personal attacks, gatekeeping, and favoritism, eroding the credibility of the journal and alienating contributors.
