Detroit is the most populous city in the U.S. state of [Michigan](#), the fourth-largest city in the Midwest and the largest city on the United States–Canada border. It is the seat of Wayne County, the most populous county in the state.

It is a teaching hospital for the Wayne State University School of Medicine and has six full-time neurosurgeons, as well as neurosurgical fellows and residents. In U.S. News & World Report's 2012-13 hospital rankings, Harper University Hospital placed 34th in the country.
