Drug [reaction](#) with [eosinophilia](#) and [systemic symptoms](#) (DRESS) is a type of [drug allergy](#) that can occur as a [reaction](#) to a large variety of [medications](#).

Temozolomide-induced DRESS syndrome

There are minimal [reports](#) of [temozolomide](#)-induced [DRESS syndrome](#). The diagnosis can be life-threatening, which makes the [glioblastoma treatment](#) with no alternative treatment option challenging. The use of [temozolomide desensitization](#) has been proposed for the management of severe adverse [cutaneous drug reactions](#) ¹⁾.

Mehta et al reported a Temozolomide-induced drug rash with eosinophilia and systemic symptoms syndrome ²⁾.
