

Footnote

A **footnote** is a brief explanatory note or reference that appears at the **bottom of the page**, used to provide:

- Additional information
- Clarification
- Citations or references

Footnotes allow the author to include important but **non-essential** content without interrupting the main flow of the text.

□ Purposes

- Cite a source (academic, clinical, legal)
- Add extra context or explanation
- Include legal disclaimers or conflicts of interest
- Clarify uncommon terminology or exceptions

□ Example in Text

The technique was first described in the early 2000s.¹⁾

This will render as a small numbered link in the body, and the full note will appear at the bottom of the page.

□ How to Use in DokuWiki

Use ²⁾ syntax for footnotes:

- Inline example:

³⁾The patient showed complete recovery.

- Multiple footnotes are numbered automatically:

⁴⁾First fact. ⁵⁾Second fact.

□ Notes

- Footnotes are automatically rendered at the bottom of the page.
- They are ideal for **references**, **clarifications**, and **non-critical** remarks.
- For inline citations with formal references, consider a dedicated bibliography section as well.
