

Goreisan

Goreisan is a traditional herbal formula in Japanese Kampo medicine. It is primarily used for the treatment of hemorrhoids. The formula is a combination of several herbal ingredients, including Japanese catnip (*Nepeta tenuifolia*), gardenia fruit (*Gardenia jasminoides*), and atractylodes rhizome (*Atractylodes lancea*).

Keishikajyutsubuto and Shinbuto are used to treat numbness and pain associated with peripheral neuropathy. Hangeshashinto has successfully attempted to treat intractable hiccoughs. It is advisable to use an extract of stable quality in accordance with the rule of thumb described in the classics. However, awareness of side effects, such as pseudo-aldosteronism caused by licorice, is important ¹⁾
