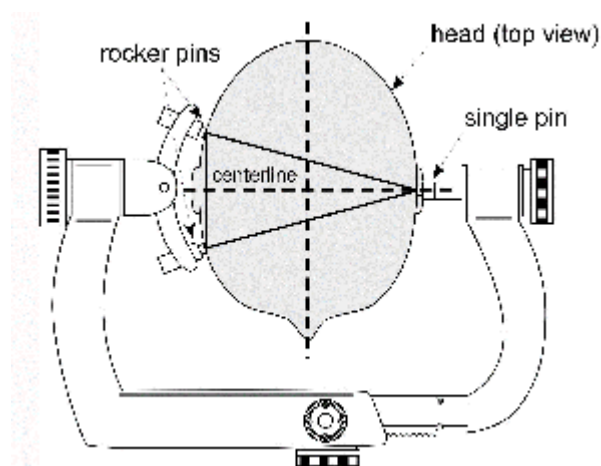


Head fixation device
