

Hypersensitivity vasculitis

Neurologic involvement is not a prominent feature of this group of vasculitides, which include:

- drug-induced allergic [vasculitis](#):

A number of [drugs](#) are associated with the development of cerebral [vasculitis](#). These include methamphetamines ("speed"), [cocaine](#) (frank vasculitis occurs ¹⁾ but is rare), [heroin](#), and [ephedrine](#)

- cutaneous vasculitis

- serum sickness: may → [encephalopathy](#), [seizures](#), coma, peripheral neuropathy, and brachial plexopathy

- Henoch-Schönlein purpura
