

# Hypodense

Hypodense [lesions](#) identified on [Computerized tomography](#) are often assumed to indicate [ischemia](#).

Doubtful hypodense left [occipital intraparenchymal area](#), probably nonspecific, unable to rule out hemorrhagic parenchymal [brain contusion](#). Hospital observation and possibly CT control are recommended.

Type 2 diabetes. Atrial fibrillation, Obesity, chronic respiratory failure

Smoker of 1-2 packs/day and severe [alcohol habit](#) Usual treatment -[MICARDIS](#) PLUS 40/12.5MG 1 tablet every 24 hours -[Dapagliflozin](#) and [metformin](#) combination 5MG/1000MG 1 tablet every 12 hours -[OMEPRAZOLE](#) 20 MG 1 tab every 24h -[ELIQUIS](#) 5MG

He [fall](#) the day before, he comments [loss of consciousness](#) lasting seconds, comments that he feels ill, referring to a sensation of [dizziness](#) with turning of objects, he refers to a sensation of relative [dyspnea](#), no vomiting, he refers to having drunk [alcohol](#)
