

# Interdural dermoid cyst

Interdural [dermoid cysts](#) (DCs) of the [cavernous sinus](#) (CS), located between the outer (dural) and inner layer (membranous) of the CS lateral wall, are rare lesions in children.

## Case reports

A 5-year-old boy with [third cranial nerve palsy](#) and [exophthalmos](#) who underwent [gross total resection](#) of an interdural DC of the right CS via a [frontotemporal approach](#). The patient had a good outcome and no recurrence at the 12-month follow-up. This is the second pediatric case of interdural DC described in the literature <sup>1)</sup>.
