

# Intracranial hypertension clinical features

Intracranial hypertension clinical features include [headache](#), [nausea/vomiting](#), and [somnolence](#) or with contralateral [weakness](#). [Compression](#) of the [convexity cerebral cortex](#) usually causes [motor deficit](#) that is more readily appreciated in the [upper extremity](#) rather than in the [leg](#), and a very subtle [deficit](#) may be only detected by looking for pronator drift.

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
