

Intracranial hypertension clinical features

Intracranial hypertension clinical features include **headache**, **nausea/vomiting**, and **somnolence** or with contralateral **weakness**. **Compression** of the **convexity cerebral cortex** usually causes **motor deficit** that is more readily appreciated in the **upper extremity** rather than in the **leg**, and a very subtle **deficit** may be only detected by looking for pronator drift.
