

An intracranial [tumor](#) is any abnormal [mass](#) of [tissue](#) located within the cranial cavity. These tumors can originate from [brain tissue](#) ([primary brain tumors](#)), or they may spread from cancers elsewhere in the body ([metastatic brain tumors](#)). Intracranial tumors may be [benign](#) or [malignant](#), and their clinical effects depend on their size, location, growth rate, and involvement of critical brain structures. Common symptoms include headache, seizures, cognitive changes, and neurological deficits.

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
