Clinical trials are substantial financial investments for their sponsors and substantial time investments for participating clinicians and patients. Trials, when done well, can change the standard of care, offering new hope for some diseases or improved understanding for others. Yet there are persistent concerns that the results of many trials languish, unpublished and unreported, preventing the scientific community from acting on important clinical data ¹.
