# Credibility & Indexing

- Publisher: BioMed Central (part of Springer Nature).
- Established: 2007.
- Indexing: Included in Scopus, PubMed, and CINAHL.
- Impact Factor (2024):
  - 2-year IF: '0.8'
  - 5-year IF: '0.9'
  - SNIP: '0.677'
  - SJR: '0.310'
- The journal is considered legitimate and well-indexed but with modest academic influence.

## 🛛 Editorial Process & Turnaround

- Median time to first decision: '32 days'
- Median time to acceptance: '145 days'
- **Peer Review**: Structured and guided, especially supportive for early-career reviewers.

# C Scope & Article Types

- Focuses on:
  - Rare or unusual presentations
  - Novel diagnostic or therapeutic approaches
  - Adverse drug reactions
  - $\circ~$  "N-of-1" studies and prevalence data from case series
- Includes clinical meta-analyses based on individual case reports.

## Strengths vs Weaknesses

Strengths	Considerations
Open-access: High daily visibility (~11,400 accesses) and over 4.5 million downloads/year	▲ Low impact factor, typical for case-report journals
Indexed in reputable databases (Scopus, PubMed)	▲ Not suitable for researchers prioritizing high citation metrics
Transparent review process and editorial integrity	▲ Less academic prestige compared to high- impact clinical journals

#### **Comparison with Alternatives**

- Compared to Cureus:
  - Cureus has faster publication, but variable indexing and review stringency.
- Compared to major clinical journals (e.g., \*Mayo Clinic Proceedings\*):
  - Those journals rarely accept isolated case reports unless embedded in broader research.

#### **Recommendations**

- Suitable for:
  - Clinicians aiming to publish instructive or rare clinical observations.
  - $\circ\,$  Early-career authors seeking entry into peer-reviewed publication.
- Less suited for:
  - Researchers focused on improving their h-index or aiming for high-impact journals.

#### **∆** Watchpoints

- The journal is 'not predatory': clear fees, legitimate peer-review, and ethical standards.
- Always verify indexing status in Scopus/PubMed before submitting.
- Avoid confusing with similarly named, non-indexed case-report outlets.

#### Conclusion

- The \*Journal of Medical Case Reports\* is a reliable and well-indexed platform for publishing clinical case material.
- It balances accessibility and visibility with rigorous but attainable editorial standards.
- Not intended for high-impact scientific contribution, but highly useful for clinical documentation, education, and academic engagement.
