

Junctional scotoma

Inferonasal fibres of the [optic nerve](#) which go into the contralateral optic nerve 4 mm before crossing over to the opposite [optic tract](#). A lesion here produces a [junctional scotoma](#).

Compression of the [optic nerve](#) near the [chiasm](#) may produce a superior temporal quadrant defect in the contralateral [eye](#) ([junctional scotoma](#) “[pie in the sky](#)” defect) from injury to the anterior [Wilbrand's knee](#).

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
