

Limited generalizability

Limited [generalizability](#), refers to the inability to extend the results of a study to other populations, settings, or circumstances beyond those specifically studied. This is a common limitation in research with narrow sample groups or highly specific conditions.

Example: A clinical trial conducted exclusively in young adult males may have limited generalizability to females or older adults.

Importance: Acknowledging limited generalizability helps prevent overgeneralization and encourages cautious interpretation of study findings when applying them to clinical practice or policy-making.
