There are 3 types of [Epidural injection](#) techniques currently being used: [transforaminal](#) (TFEI), [interlaminar](#) (ILEI), and caudal epidural injections (CEI).

In 1997 Carette et al stated that although [epidural corticosteroid injections](#) of methylprednisolone may afford short-term improvement in leg pain and sensory deficits in patients with sciatica due to a herniated nucleus pulposus, this treatment offers no significant functional benefit, nor does it reduce the need for surgery ¹⁾.
