

Lumbosacral fracture dislocation

Roy-Camille et al. was the first to describe this injury as a “suicide jumper’s fracture” ¹⁾.

Lumbosacral fracture dislocation is a rare entity mainly occurred in high-energy trauma accidents ^{2) 3)}

Intimate and strong osteoligamentous elements exist in this especial area of spine protecting neural elements that are responsible for the innervations of lower extremities, bowel, bladder and sexual organs ⁶⁾
