


Medical report

A **medical report** is an official [document](#) that provides detailed information about a patient's [health status](#), [medical history](#), [diagnosis](#), [treatment](#), and [prognosis](#). It is typically written by a healthcare [professional](#), such as a doctor or specialist, and serves various purposes, including:

1. **Clinical Documentation** – Recording patient progress, diagnoses, and treatments.
2. **Legal Evidence** – Serving as a [legal](#) record in cases of medical disputes or insurance claims.
3. **Communication** – Facilitating information exchange among healthcare providers for coordinated care.
4. **Research & Education** – Contributing to medical studies and training.

A medical report may include:
- Patient's details (name, age, gender, etc.)
- [Medical history](#) (previous conditions, allergies, medications)
- [Examination](#) findings (physical, neurological, or laboratory results)
- [Diagnosis](#) (including differential diagnoses)
- [Treatment](#) plan (medications, surgery, therapy)
- Follow-up recommendations
