

Meningioma en plaque

[Meningioma](#) en plaque (MEP) is rare characterized more by its clinical and biological behavior than its histological appearance.

It represents a morphological subgroup within the meningiomas defined by a carpet or sheet-like lesion that infiltrates the [dura](#) and sometimes invades the [bone](#).

[Hyperostosis](#) of the [skull](#) is one of the characteristic signs of MEP. This bony change can produce clinical symptoms and signs in MEP by pressing against adjacent structures ¹⁾.

Differential diagnosis includes [fibrous dysplasia](#), osteoma, and osteoblastic metastasis.
