**2016 John Oakley Fellowship** The Joint Section on Pain is pleased to announce that applications are being accepted for the 2016 John Oakley Fellowship. The Oakley Fellowship supports a 2-3 month traveling experience to learn neurosurgical pain techniques and/or refine their use. Eligible applicants are residents PGY4 or later or neurosurgeons within two years of finishing residency. ...

**August 1, 2016 Codman Neurotrauma and Critical Care Fellowship** This one-year award is intended to sponsor a fellow or young neurosurgeon within three years of training to conduct clinical or basic science research in the field of neurotrauma or critical care.

**December 1st of each calendar year Cone Pevehouse MD Award** This award is made for the best resident-submitted abstract of content and methodology relating to socio-economic issues.

**Donaghy Lectureship** This is an invited lectureship at AANS/CNS section on cerebrovascular surgery scientific session at the AANS Annual Meeting.

**Farber Award** Sponsored by the Farber Foundation, the Farber awardee is selected by a subcommittee from the Joint Section on Tumors and the Society for Neuro-Oncology and is presented at the annual meeting of the respective societies on alternating years.

**Galbraith Award** This is awarded to the best abstract submission by a resident at the CNS Annual Meeting.

**CNS abstract submission deadline Hydrocephalus Association Award** This award is given for the best paper presented at the Winter Meeting of the Joint Section on Pediatric Neurological Surgery by a resident-in-training on the topic of hydrocephalus. Eligibility for the Shulman Award supersedes eligibility for the Hydrocephalus Award. The award is given at the Winter Meeting of the...

**Section annual meeting abstract submission deadline Ingraham Distinguished Service Award for Pediatric Neurosurgery** This award is presented to an eminent pediatric neurosurgeon for a lifetime of dedicated service to the field. Candidates are nominated by any three active members of the Joint Section on Pediatric Neurological Surgery.
