A neurosurgery [team](#) typically consists of highly specialized professionals working together to provide [comprehensive](#) care to patients with conditions affecting the brain, spinal cord, and peripheral nervous system. Below is an overview of the roles commonly found within such a team:

1. Neurosurgeon

1. **Role:** Leads the surgical and medical care of patients with neurological disorders requiring surgery.
2. **Responsibilities:**
 1. Performing brain and spinal surgeries.
 2. Developing treatment plans.
 3. Overseeing patient care during and after surgery.

2. Surgical Assistants

1. **Role:** Assists the neurosurgeon during surgical procedures.
2. **Responsibilities:**

10. Neuropsychologists

1. **Role:** Evaluates cognitive and emotional functioning.
2. **Responsibilities:**
 1. Conducting assessments pre- and post-surgery.
 2. Offering psychological support to patients and families.

11. Research and Clinical Fellows

1. **Role:** Engages in clinical research and assists in patient care.
2. **Responsibilities:**
 1. Conducting studies on innovative neurosurgical techniques.
 2. Supporting the team in complex cases.

12. Administrative and Support Staff

1. **Role:** Manages logistics, scheduling, and patient communication.

2. Responsibilities:

1. Scheduling surgeries and follow-ups.
2. Coordinating interdepartmental communication.
