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Non-invasive

Non-invasive refers to any medical or diagnostic procedure that does 'not involve penetration of the body' or insertion of instruments through the skin or into body cavities.

Characteristics

- No incision or puncture of the skin
- No insertion into internal organs
- Minimal physical risk or discomfort

Examples

- Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI)
- Ultrasound
- Electroencephalography (EEG)
- Non-invasive blood pressure monitoring
- Transcranial Doppler ultrasound

Comparison

Term	Description
'Non-invasive'	External procedure, no body entry
'Minimally invasive'	Small incisions or limited body access (e.g., laparoscopy)
'Invasive'	Direct entry into body or organs (e.g., open surgery, catheterization)

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
