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Patient Outcome

A **patient outcome** refers to any **measurable change in health status** (positive or negative) that occurs as a **result of medical care, intervention, or disease progression**.

Types of Patient Outcomes

- Clinical outcomes: Survival, recovery, complication rates, recurrence, neurological status.
- Functional outcomes: Ability to perform daily activities, mobility, independence.
- Quality of life (QoL): Physical, emotional, and social well-being as perceived by the patient.
- **Patient-reported outcomes (PROs)**: Symptoms, satisfaction, pain levels, reported directly by the patient.

Importance

- Central to evidence-based medicine and clinical decision-making.
- Used to assess the efficacy, safety, and value of interventions or procedures.
- Required for clinical trials, healthcare quality metrics, and treatment guidelines.

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
