

Project

A **project** is a temporary and organized set of activities designed to achieve a specific [goal](#) or [outcome](#) within defined constraints such as time, resources, and scope.

Key Characteristics

- **Temporary:** Has a clear beginning and end
- **Goal-oriented:** Aims to produce a unique result (product, service, or outcome)
- **Structured:** Follows a defined plan or methodology
- **Constrained:** Limited by time, budget, and resources
- **Collaborative:** Often involves a multidisciplinary team

Phases of a Project

- **Initiation:** Define objectives and feasibility
- **Planning:** Outline tasks, resources, and timelines
- **Execution:** Carry out the planned activities
- **Monitoring:** Track progress and adjust as needed
- **Closure:** Finalize deliverables and evaluate outcomes

Example in Clinical Context

- A hospital implements a **project** to reduce surgical site infections by 30% over 6 months, involving protocol revision, staff training, and monitoring indicators.
