

Pseudohypoxic brain swelling

Pseudohypoxic [brain swelling](#) (PHBS) is a rare and potentially fatal [complication](#) that may occur in patients following uneventful brain surgery. Fan presented a case of PHBS after [chronic subdural hematoma surgery](#) that developed after [drilling](#) and [drainage](#). Neuroimaging findings, pathogenic factors, and therapy are also discussed ¹⁾.
