

Cerebral hyperperfusion syndrome (CHS) is a common complication after [direct bypass surgery](#) in patients with [Moyamoya disease \(MMD\)](#). Since preventive measures may be inadequate, Yang et al. assessed whether the [blood flow difference](#) between the [superficial temporal artery \(STA\)](#) and [recipient vessels](#) ( $\Delta BF$ ) and the direct perfusion range (DPR) are related to CHS.

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
