

Retinal hemorrhage

A [retinal hemorrhage](#) is an [ocular hemorrhage](#) that occurs when blood vessels in the retina begin to bleed. A hemorrhage, or bleeding, happens when these tiny blood vessels are damaged by injury or disease. Retinal hemorrhage can be caused by diabetes, high blood pressure, head injuries, and even sudden changes in air pressure.
