


Sphenoidal emissary foramen



the great wings of the sphenoid bone, medial to the **foramen ovale**, a small aperture, the **sphenoidal emissary foramen**, may occasionally be seen (it is often absent) opposite the root of the **pterygoid process**. When present, it opens below near the scaphoid fossa. Vesalius was the first to describe and illustrate this foramen, and it thus sometimes bears the name of **foramen Vesalii** (meaning foramen of Vesalius). Other names include **foramen venosum** and **canalculus sphenoidalalis**.
