□	The Brand Neurosurgeon	Influences more than operates. Thinks in hashtags.	□ Ethically dishonest
□	The Toxic Climber	Loyal upward, ruthless downward. Sows conflict, exploits hierarchy, and sabotages sideways.	□ Ethically dishonest
□	The Fragile Despot	Needs loyalty, not truth. Leads by fear, not merit. Craves admiration, punishes dissent.	□ Ethically dishonest
□	The Enabler Hostage	Built a career by orbiting power. Lost themselves in the process. Echoes authority, silences dissent, and protects dysfunction — not out of malice, but dependence. Loyalty replaces integrity.	□ Ethically dishonest
□	The Agreeable Opportunist	Nice but hollow. Smart but not wise. Climbs the system by staying inoffensive and useful. Motivated by recognition and financial gain, not purpose. Avoids depth. Avoids disruption.	□ Ethically dishonest

☐	The Metric Addict	Optimizes dashboards. Reality becomes a threat.	⚠ Systemically dishonest
☐	The Dogmatic Disciple	Traditions worshipped, not questioned.	⚠ Systemically dishonest
☐	The Careerist Believer	Believes what sells. Loyal to promotion, not principles.	⚠ Systemically dishonest
☐	The Insecure Performer	Acts fast to avoid exposure. Bravado masks fear.	⚠ Systemically dishonest

☐ **Cognitively or Emotionally Flawed (Often Unconscious)**

Icon	Archetype	Description	Dishonesty Type
☐	The Cynical Fossil	Once brilliant, now bitter. Thinks rejection = wisdom.	☐ Cognitively flawed
☐	The Hollow Technician	Operates well, thinks poorly. No reflection. No growth.	☐ Cognitively flawed
☐	The Detached Craftsman	Precise in low-stakes surgery. Disengaged from the team, the mission, and the mess. Chooses peace over presence.	☐ Cognitively flawed
☐	The Externally Validated Impostor	Brilliant. Recognized. Quoted abroad. But inside — a fracture he can't fix. Built on international visibility, he travels not to grow but to escape. Feeds on admiration yet resents dependence. Doesn't want your job — just doesn't know what he wants. Not leading — orbiting. Needs attention to feel real. Despite admiration from juniors and obvious talent in the OR, he avoids the top tier he could reach — choosing visibility over vocation.	☐ Cognitively flawed
☐	The Misaligned Drifter	Avoids conflict but also purpose. Competent but disconnected. Hesitates not from doubt in skill, but from doubt in path. May be in therapy. May be seeking escape. Stays not from vocation — but inertia. His drift is subtle, but contagious.	☐ Cognitively flawed
☐	The Smiling Strategist	Courteous, adaptable, and relentlessly moderate. Believes in “patience and work,” but uses it as camouflage. Avoids conviction, avoids conflict, avoids creation. Technically competent but ethically absent. Builds a career by mirroring power, echoing consensus, and staying useful — never essential. A disappointment that took ten years to notice.	☐ Cognitively flawed

☐ **A Reflective Antidote (Actively Aware)**

Icon	Archetype	Description	Dishonesty Type
☐	The Uncomfortable Reflector	Doesn't think he's above the problem. Thinks he might be part of it. Reflects before reacting. Learns instead of performing. Questions his own alignment — even when no one's watching.	☐ Actively resisted

□ Legend

- □ Ethically dishonest – Intentional prioritization of ego, gain, or image over patient well-being.
- △ Systemically dishonest – Behavior shaped by broken incentives, normalized in toxic environments.
- □ Cognitively flawed – Subtle distortions in thinking that become harmful when left unchecked.
- * Emotionally withdrawn – Chooses emotional disengagement as a survival mechanism. Absent in crisis, quiet in culture.
- □ Actively resisted – Aware of the risk of distortion, and committed to staying intellectually honest.
