


Systemic [amyloidosis](#) is a diseased condition where misfolded proteins deposit in various organs in the form of [amyloids](#), and [transthyretin](#) deposition, termed ATTR amyloidosis, can be either an age-related amyloid formation from misfolded wild-type TTR (ATTRwt) or by hereditary TTR malfunction due to mutation in the [TTR](#) gene (ATTRv). Although ATTRwt amyloidosis can cause various diseases, such as cardiac failure, conduction disturbances, [arrhythmias](#) and [carpal tunnel syndrome](#), it is still under-recognised considering its clinical significance.

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
