

# Urinary incontinence

Urinary [incontinence](#) (UI), involuntary urination, is any leakage of urine or fecal matter. It can be a common and distressing problem, which may have a profound impact on [quality of life](#). Urinary incontinence almost always results from an underlying treatable medical condition but is under-reported to medical practitioners

[Idiopathic normal pressure hydrocephalus](#) (iNPH) is a progressive [neurodegenerative disease](#) in the [elderly](#) with enlarged [ventricles](#) and normal or slightly elevated cerebrospinal fluid pressure, clinically characterized by an insidious onset and gradual progression of impairments of [gait](#), [balance](#), [cognition](#), with [urinary incontinence](#)<sup>1)</sup>.
